The European Union Choir is one of the very few music ensembles that can boast about being part of the most ambitious political project of the last 60 years.

The European Union Choir and its 85 choristers of 20 different nationalities are the human and musical incarnation of the Europe of "Brussels". With a contagious enthusiasm and an insatiable thirst for musical spread discoveries, **they** а double message of peace and joy for Europe and the World.

Directed since 1990 by their ebullient Choir Director, Dirk De Moor, the European Union Choir, founded in 1958 in the wake of the Treaty of Rome, has acquired an established and sound reputation of the highest musical quality and of rigor and commitment.

Through exploring year after varied and ambitious year repertoires, they multiply their musical cooperation with major orchestras such as: the Belgian National Orchestra, the Symphonic Orchestra and Choir of La Monnaie Opera House, the Strasbourg Philharmonic Orchestra. the Brussels Orchestral Ensemble, the Philharmonia of the Nations ... to mention but a few.

Since their foundation in 1958, they have given themselves a mission: that of accompanying the construction of Europe and the promotion Europe through music.

Artistic Director



Dirk DE MOOR

Born in Antwerp into a family of artists – his father, Bob De Moor, cartoonist, was the right hand man of Hergé -, Dirk De Moor fell, at a very young age, into the magical potion of choral singing. At 8 years old, he was noticed by Abbot Caron, he joined the Choir of the Collège St-Pierre, Uccle (Brussels), which was the Belgian equivalent of the "Petits Chanteurs à la Crois-de-Bois, directed by the latter. It was a revelation. Touched for life by music, he attended the Uccle and Saint-Gilles (Bruxelles) music academies and then entered the Brussels Royal Music Conservatory where he studied choral conducting and singing with singer Nicole

Between 1979 and 1985, he was a member of the vocal ensembles of the French and Flemish Belgian Radio-Television (RTBF) as well as the Choir of La Monnaie Royal Opera. Since 1971 he has conducted 10 mixed and male choirs. In 1974, he founded Le Petite Orgue, an ensemble of 12 male singers that he directed until 1994. With him, Le Petit Orgue explored the broad spectrum of male vocal, from Middle Age to contemporary composers and specialised in the works of Franz Schubert and the orthodox repertoire. The ensemble appeared 450 times in Belgium and abroad and made recordings. In 1983 it was awarded First prize at the 20th International Choral Encounters in Montreux. In 1987, during a recital. Dirk De Moor directed the Male Vocal Ensemble of La Monnaie Opera. In June 1988, he directed the Fêtes de La Musique in Brussels with the participation of 600 choristers. From 1986 to 1997, he led the Male Vocal Ensemble of the Great Synagogue of Brussels (e.a. recital with Joseph Malovany, cantor at the Fifth Avenue Synagogue of New York), a professional quartet ensuring, thanks to a rich, specific repertoire, the 80 great feasts and religious services that mark the Hebrew liturgical year.

Having devoted his life to music, Dirk De Moor is no less driven by a humanist ideal and a deep European conviction. In 1990, when Dirk De Moor took on the musical direction of The European Union Choir, he experienced the encounter of his convictions with his musical vocation.

Since then, with the fire that characterises him, he has never ceased to transmit to the choristers his passion and demands necessary for a high quality music programme. His efforts and his commitment have delivered results. With him, The European Union Choir is moving towards a very high quality music ensemble, exploring an ambitious and often little known repertoire and enhancing cooperation with professional ensembles.

Dirk De moor is also supervising several training courses in choral singing. He is part of national and international juries: Schubert Competition, Vienna, International Choral Encounters, Montreux, etc.

Une Neuvième en final

Salle comble pour le Philharmonique de Strasbourg qui a assuré, vendredi soir, le concert de clôture du 74^e Festival de musique de Strasbourg.

MARKO LETONJA, le nouveau chef du Philharmonique, était attendu pour diriger ce concert. Empêché, il a cédé sa place au pupitre à Claude Schnitzler, bien connu dans sa ville natale, qui a mené d'une baguette très sûre la Neuvième Symphonie de Beethoven à un succès mérité.

La Neuvième avec chœurs de Beethoven a accompagné toute l'histoire du Festival de Strasbourg. Elle était de mise pour cette édition de son 80° anniversaire, d'autant plus qu'elle a présidé aux débuts, en 1932, des manifestations organisées par la Société des Amis de la musique.

Le lien entre le festival et les institutions de la ville a été souligné dans la laudation prononcée par

Roland Ries, sénateur-maire de Strasbourg lors de la remise au festival d'un prix de la Fondation européenne pour la culture de Bále et du Forum européen de la Culture de Strasbourg et Baden Baden. La Ville parrainait d'ailleurs à juste titre cette soirée finale du festival.

Le programme d'abord annoncé prévoyait, avant Beethoven, un hommage à Messiaen pour le 20* anniversaire de sa mort, avec L'Ascension, une solide partition qui avait inauguré l'œuvre symphonique du compositeur français. Remplacée par l'Ouverture d'Oberon, prélude au romantisme que signalent le cor, ici au beau son de Kevin Cleary, et de fins traits bien détaillés, et les Variations sur un thème de Haydn de Brahms. Le temps a manqué à l'orchestre, grandement sollicité aussi durant la semaine à l'Opéra, de peaufiner

à fond cette œuvre de jeunesse riche d'inventions.

Impeccable force de frappe pour l'Ode à la jole

Mais on était venu essentiellement pour la symphonie avec chœurs. Claude Schnitzler la conçoit dans des tempi fluides, sans lenteur, mais qui poussent constamment en avant la projection musicale. L'allegro garde la vision cosmique de ses résonances de quintes vides, le scherzo ne laisse pas tomber son dynamisme rythmique ponctué par les énergiques coups de timbales, l'adagio ne tient pas à piétiner ou à s'endormir.

Unité de chaque mouvement, et bien sûr aussi pour l'apothéose du final, où la part purement symphonique du début n'a pas été négligée avant l'intervention des solistes et des chœurs. Même si le récitatif du baryton qui initie l'intervention des voix a été calamiteux, (mais on ne peut prévoir un refroidissement subit), le quatuor formé par Susanne Bernhard, Tanya Baumgartner, Lance Ryan et Detlef Roth, tous assez jeunes chanteurs qui font une belle carrière en Europe et sur tous les continents, a trouvé une remarquable homogénéité. Et les chœurs de l'Union européenne, venus de Bruxelles, et que l'on connaissait déjà ici, instruits par Dirk De Moor, ont constitué l'impeccable force de frappe pour l'Ode à la joie, affirmation humaniste, digne d'être l'hymne dont la force de conviction s'impose. Inutile de dire que tous les interprètes, longuement applaudis jusqu'à une ovation debout, ont été encore fêtés quand ils ont bissé le final du final de la symphonie. MARC MUNCH

He was born in Brussels in 1956 into a family of architects and as a well-known cartoonist and scenographer. He was only 16 years old when his works were published for the first time.

He is also the author of two underground stations: "Porte de Hal" in Brussels and 'Arts et Métiers" in Paris. He was also designed the giant Pavillon des Utopies (A Plant of Visions) which received 5 million visitors during the Universal Exhibition in Hanover in 2000, as well as the Pavillon of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg at the Universal Exhibition in Seville.
